The 2019 Quilt Show dates are **Saturday, September 28 9:00am - 5:00pm** and **Sunday, September 29 12:00pm - 5:00pm**. As in the past, set up will be the day before the show opens on Friday, September 27 9:00am - 4:00pm. Ticket pricing will be voted on and the pre-sale process will be discussed at the March meeting. We are excited that we will again be using the St. John's Armenian Church Conference Center. Our initial discussions with them indicate that they will be making some interior improvements in the early part of this year (e.g. painting, enhanced lighting, etc.) that will benefit our event. We believe its location in Southfield allowed us to expand our audience in 2017 and leverage the great publicity that was put in place by the 2017 committee. **All members will be asked to work at least one 4 hour shift during the show.**

For the March 9 Meeting, members are invited to bring in finished quilts that they would like to be considered as the feature quilt for the Show and related publicity. Each quilt will have the opportunity to "walk the runway" before members fill out their ballots. With all the beautiful quilts we have seen in recent months, we should have a nice variety from which to choose. The winner will be announced at the meeting.

Members are also encouraged to fill out a brief submission form to give us an idea of how many quilts we may have for the show. **At this time, we are only looking for 3 pieces of information.** We ask that you simply identify the names or intended names (if it is not finished) or type of quilt (charity, silent auction or challenge quilt) of up to 5 (five)

quilts you would like to consider putting in the show along with its dimensions. This information will be used to develop a preliminary layout design. We will inform the membership of the final number of quilts that can submitted before the May meeting so that we can begin collecting the more detailed submission forms at the May and July Meetings. Again, this list of up to 5 quilts can include charity quilts, challenge quilts, and silent auction quilts. Specific guidelines for challenge and silent auction quilts will be defined and discussed at the March Meeting. Please see the form attached to your newsletter email. We will be requesting photos of your quilts with the formal submission form that you can begin submitting in May as we have in the past. **Again, the detailed quilt submission form is NOT due in March.** Those members that fill out the form will have their names entered into a prize drawing at the meeting.

GLAAQN SASH POLICY

The Executive Board of Great Lakes African American Quilter's Network (GLAAQN) hereby set forth the following policy regarding the official accessory of the organization, (GLAAQN sash).

This policy states that the proper construction of said sash as well as how and when it is to be worn by the members. According to the approved instruction the finished size of the sash should be 7" wide by 70" long. It is to be constructed only of various lengths of African fabrics, (and the logo patch which contains the organization name and the pempamsie symbol which has been adopted as the official symbol.

Each member is required to wear the sash over the left shoulder at quilt shows, members and immediate family funerals and any event stipulated by the Executive Board.

It is important that members adhere to this policy. Upon joining the organization each member will receive a copy of the sash instructions, a picture of the completed sash and a Great Lakes African American Network (GLAAQN) logo patch.
